

IMPORTANT INFORMATION CONCERNING YOUR PRESCRIPTION DRUG CARD

Prime Therapeutics LLC (Prime), the new pharmacy benefit manager for the State and School Employees' Health Insurance Plan, recently sent new prescription ID cards to Plan participants. Unfortunately, an error happened while the cards were being processed. Some important information was printed incorrectly. The sample prescription ID card below shows the **correct** Rx BIN and Rx PCN numbers.

Corrected prescription ID cards are in the process of being printed and mailed out by Prime. Participants should begin receiving these replacement cards soon. If you need to fill a prescription after January 1, 2016, and have not yet received a corrected ID card, you should present your original Prime ID card to the pharmacy and provide the correct Rx BIN and Rx PCN numbers listed above to have your prescription filled. Pharmacies have already been notified of the printing error to hopefully avoid any disruption in filling your prescriptions. Once you receive your replacement ID card, please destroy the original card. **Please remember that your new Prime prescription ID card is not activated until January 1, 2016**. Until then, you should continue to use your Catamaran prescription ID card through December 31, 2015.
