PURPOSE: To provide policy on the creation, suspension, and

modification of academic programs and structure

REVIEWER: Accreditation Liaison

REVIEW DATE: Fall 2021 and every 3 years thereafter

OPERATING DETAILS:

1. Creation, suspension, and modification of academic programs and structure that represent a significant departure from the institution's existing operation may require prior notification to Mississippi Institutions of Higher Learning (IHL) and/or Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) and when required, approval prior to implementation of these changes.

- 2. IHL has created administrative guidelines for the following substantive changes:
 - a) New degree program
 - b) Renaming an existing degree program
 - c) Consolidation of existing degree program
 - d) Suspension or deletion of existing degree program
 - e) Offer an existing degree program by distance learning
 - f) Offer an off-campus degree program
 - g) Creation of new academic unit
 - h) Reorganization of an existing academic unit
 - i) Deletion of an existing academic unit
- 3. SACSCOC defines substantive change as "a significant modification or expansion of the nature and scope of an accredited institution" and, under federal regulation, states that it includes the following changes:
 - a) Any change in the established mission or objectives of the institution
 - b) Any change in legal status, form of control, or ownership of the institution
 - c) The addition of courses or programs that represent a significant departure, either in content or method of delivery, from those that were offered when the institution was last evaluated
 - d) The addition of courses or programs of study at a degree or credential level different from that which is included in the institution's current accreditation or reaffirmation.
 - e) A change from clock hours to credit hours
 - f) A substantial increase in the number of clock or credit hours awarded for successful completion of a program

- g) The establishment of an additional location geographically apart from the main campus at which the institution offers at least 50% of an educational program
- h) The establishment of a branch campus
- i) Closing a program, off-campus site, branch campus or institution
- j) Entering into a collaborative academic arrangement that includes only the initiation of a dual or joint academic program with another institution
- k) Acquiring another institution or a program or location of another institution
- l) Adding a permanent location at a site where the institution is conducting a teach-out program for a closed institution
- m) Entering into a contract by which an entity not eligible for Title IV funding offers 25% or more of one or more of the accredited institution's programs
- 4. Depending on the type of change, notification may need to occur six or more months prior to the implementation of a change and appropriate documentation must be prepared and submitted to IHL and/or SACSCOC.
- 5. Individuals proposing or responsible for evaluating changes should be familiar with the appropriate IHL and SACSCOC regulations.

- 6. To ensure that all proposals are evaluated for compliance with relevant SACSCOC policies, the SACSCOC Accreditation Liaison shall serve as a non-voting, ex-officio member of Academic Council, Graduate Council, and Undergraduate Curriculum Council.
- 7. If differences occur between MUW PS#1308 and the SACSCOC or IHL policy, the SACSCOC or IHL policy has precedence.
