
Title III, Part A Strengthening Institutions Grant (2018-23)



Woodward Hines Education Foundation IMPACT Grant (2020-24)

- Increase retention of transfer students (non-RN/BSN) to 83% (Baseline: 76%)
- ► Increase 4-year graduation rate of transfer students to 65% (Baseline 60.2%)
- ▶ Decrease the melt rate of incoming transfer students (non-RN/BSN) selected for financial aid verification from a baseline of 41% to 30%


Transfer Retention (Non-RN/BSN)

Emerging Student Success Priorities

- Expanding access to resources for distance students
 - ▶ Pre-Pandemic
 - ▶ Online Orientation Platform (MUW)
 - ▶ Online Tutoring Platform (Title III)
 - Current and Ongoing
 - ▶ Remote Proctoring (MUW)
 - Remote access to Peer Mentoring (Title III)
 - Laptop and WiFi Hotspot checkout (Title III and Hearin Foundation)

Emerging Student Success Priorities

- Increasing support for at-risk/underserved students
 - ▶ 41% of current FTFT Freshmen Cohort (Range between 40-47%)
 - Pandemic has negatively impacted the education of all K-12 and higher education students in Mississippi and surrounding states
 - ▶ IHL ACT requirement on hold for 2020-21 and 2021-22 (national trend)
 - Smaller number of high school graduates in the future
 - Retention Gap for Minority and Pell recipients

Emerging Student Success Priorities

- Maintaining support for our freshmen students while expanding support for the transfer cohort
 - MUW is primarily a Transfer Institution
 - ► A significant number of Transfer students are placed on academic probation within 2 semesters of arriving at MUW
