Council Actions for April 5, 2019

College of Arts, Sciences & Education

1. Add course to General Education Curriculum- PSC 108 Introduction to Chemistry
2. Add course to General Education Curriculum- PSC 108L Introduction to Chemistry Lab

As there were no science faculty in attendance, Dr. Larsen reminded the Council of PSC 108 and PSC 108L history where new courses were proposed. Intent was that these courses be added to the general education curriculum.

Josh Hanes made the motion to approve the proposals as presented. Hillary Richardson seconded the motion and the proposals were approved unanimously.

College of Business & Professional Studies

Marty Brock presented the following proposal:

3. Offer a New Curriculum - Bachelor of University Studies

The proposal is to serve C2C students. IHL has given blanket approval for such a degree.

- It mirrors Professional Studies degree with general education emphasis (additional courses in social science, critical thinking, mathematics and science, and humanities)

- Degree a total of 120 hours
- Kristi DiClemente asked about changing the focus group name regarding Humanities/Social Sciences
- Amanda Dahl commented that the focus group names do not appear on student transcript
- Dee Larsen commented that the number of students we have for this degree is very low.

Kristi DiClemente made the motion to approve the proposal as presented. Amanda Dahl seconded the motion and the proposal was approved unanimously.

College of Nursing & Health Sciences

Tammie McCoy and Kathy Shappley presented the following proposals:

4. Modify an Existing Curriculum - Speech Language Pathology
 - a. Change of science requirements

This proposal changes the science requirement. The program needs to have a chemistry/physics with a lab.

Amanda Dahl made the motion to approve the proposal as presented. Marty Hatton seconded the motion and the proposal was approved unanimously.

5. Offer a New Course – SPA 450 Independent Study
6. Offer a New Course – SPA 451 Independent Study

These new courses will be taught in different semesters, one in the fall and one in the spring. SPL does not have any other independent studies classes.

Hillary Richardson made the motion to approve the proposals as presented. Chad Murphy seconded the motion and the proposals were approved unanimously.

Old Business

- Revising UCC Forms – Josh and Hillary have been revising forms. Dee Dee distributed a draft of the new form Undergraduate Curriculum Approval form. This will be used for new curriculum and changing current curriculum. Kristi suggested adding language that minors, concentration, emphasis is required to complete the form because not required to do IHL Appendix 8. There was some discussion on having separate forms for new majors.
- Degree Works – no discussion on degree works
