Council Actions for April 9, 2010

College of Arts & Sciences

Beverly Joyce and Robert Gibson attended the meeting in order to present the following proposals for Art and Design:

1. Modify an Existing Course – ART 315 Women Artists in History

This proposal is to eliminate the prerequisite. Dorothy Kerzel made a motion to accept the proposal as written. Deborah Miranda seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

2. Modify an Existing Curriculum – Art History Minor

This proposal is reducing the number of credit hours required from 21 to 18 to provide more options for students. There was some discussion concerning ART 399 and ART 491. Dorothy Kerzel made a motion to accept the proposal as presented with the following changes: Special Topics and/or Supervised Independent Research in Art History will be accepted towards Art History Minor with approval of the department chair. Dee Larson seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

School of Professional Studies

3. Create a New Curriculum – Bachelor of Technology in Professional Studies with Concentration in Management Information Systems

Information Systems and Management Information Systems is the most popular program name seen in higher education especially community colleges. Using the strength of the MIS brand should not only help in recruiting, but also be a boon to the program's graduates as they compete for jobs in the local, regional, national, or even global workforce. The prospective BT MIS student already has a strong technological foundation on which to build. This curriculum will supplement this foundation with the managerial skills necessary to assume leadership roles and provide a foundation in accounting, economics, marketing, management found in a traditional business program.

Deborah Miranda made a motion to accept the above proposal as written. Cay Lollar mentioned that the committee would like to see approval letters from the Dean on letterhead stationery. Dorothy Kerzel asked if the Business faculty approved this proposal. She noted that we turned other proposals back to the department due to lack of approval from the faculty and that we should require the same of all departments. Dee Larson assured the committee that all faculty were on board with this new degree program. Dee seconded and the motion passed unanimously.
