Sheila Westbrook, ECET2GT Co-Director

In 2017, Sheila traveled with Teachers 2 Teachers – International to Belize and the Galapagos Islands to conduct professional development training with elementary mathematics teachers. After returning from his internship there, Hagan was offered a full-time position at Tesla Motors, which he declined in order to pursue his own company, Vibe, LLC, co-founded with fellow student, Kaylie Mitchell. Vibe, created at the MSU Center for Entrepreneurship and Outreach, makes a patented product called Glo, a liquid-activated drink light. Since its founding at MSU, Glo has been seen by more than 10 million viewers on social media and has sold over half a million units in 34 countries.

Bob Fuller

Dr. Fuller is the Visiting Assistant Clinical Professor in the Department of Educational Leadership at Mississippi State University in Starkville, where he is the liaison for the Partnership School between the MSU College of Education and the Starkville Okfuskeha Consolidated School District. He served as an Assistant Professor in Educational Leadership at the Mississippi University for Women for seven years. He is a retired educator with twenty-five years experience in the public schools of Mississippi. Bob holds a B.S., M.Ed., and Ph.D. from Mississippi State University. He was principal of Armstrong Middle School (AMS) in Starkville for 15 years where he was named Mississippi's Middle School Principal of the Year in 2003 and the school district administrator of the year on three occasions. In addition, he was president of the Mississippi Association for Middle Level Education from 1996-98, the state's affiliate with the Association for Middle Level Education. While Dr. Fuller was principal of AMS, it was an acknowledged leader in the middle school concept movement. The school was recognized by The Education Trust as a "High Poverty School Exceeding Expectations," was a model school for the Mid-South Middle Start Initiative, and one of six middle schools in the nation chosen to develop a middle school reform model through the U.S. Department of Education. Today, Dr. Fuller serves as a mentor to several middle and high school principals and conducts professional development in the public schools of Mississippi.



Jennifer Gregory

Jennifer Gregory is the Program Director for the John C. Stennis Center for Public Service in Starkville, Mississippi. The Stennis Center was established by Congress in 1988 as a living tribute to the public service career of John C. Stennis who served in the United States Senate for over 41 years and has offices in Starkville and Washington, D.C.. Jennifer is also the Founding Principal of Sidewalk Strategies, LLC, a consulting firm specializing in community development, downtown revitalization, strategic planning and visioning, governmental relations, and marketing. Her clients include political action committees, community development organizations, and main street associations in Mississippi, Arkansas, South Carolina, and Alabama. Jennifer most recently served as the Chief Executive Officer of the Greater Starkville Development Partnership from 2012 - 2016, a community development umbrella organization that consists of the Starkville Area Chamber of Commerce, Starkville Visitors & Convention Council, Okfuskeha County Economic Development Authority, and Starkville Main Street Association. Jennifer was named a Top 50 under 40 professional by Mississippi Business Journal in 2016 and is a member of the Board of Governors of the Starkville Country Club. She serves as President of Parents for Public Schools Starkville, Co-President of Sudduth Elementary PTO, and Vice President for Operations for Bully Bloc.
