#### Undergraduate and Graduate Bulletin Language

Purpose and Benefit: The SLP Automatic Admission provides high performing Mississippi University for Women undergraduate students who meet specific academic criteria and character standards, automatic acceptance into The W's Master of Science in Speech-Language Pathology program. This can provide peace of mind and allow students to focus on their undergraduate studies knowing they have a secured spot in our graduate program. The student will be able to bypass the standard application process thus eliminating the additional time, effort, and expense this process typically requires.

**Eligibility:** Applicants of The W's Automatic Admission for the M.S. Speech-Language Pathology Degree Program must meet the following requirements:

- Be admitted to The W and the Speech-Language Pathology undergraduate program prior to the Fall semester of their junior year
- Complete 4 consecutive semesters toward a Bachelor's Degree in Speech Pathology from The W
- Be in good standing at The W
- Maintain at least a B in each SLP prerequisite course
- Maintain at least a B in each biological sciences with a lab, physical sciences with a lab, mathematics, social/behavioral sciences, and mathematics prerequisite course, which must have been completed within the last six years
- Achieve a 3.70 or higher overall GPA through completion of ALL undergraduate coursework
- Submit 3 proofs of support from The W's SLP Department faculty indicating "no concerns"

Admissions Process: All application documents must be in the MUW SLP program's office and/or postmarked by 5 p.m. on November 1st of their senior year to be considered for early selection. See Automatic Admission Application for details.

Additional Requirements: Eligible students must obtain 25 guided observation hours before graduating from MUW. Failure to acquire these hours may delay completion of the graduate program in speech-language pathology. Additionally, students must earn a Bachelor of Science in Speech Language Pathology from MUW.

**Voluntary or Administrative Withdrawal:** Students who wish to withdraw from The W's graduate SLP Program must do so through the College of Nursing and Health Sciences. The last day to withdraw from The W is listed on the Academic Calendar. Once the withdrawal form is processed, the action is irreversible. Withdrawal does not necessarily indicate a clearance of

financial or other obligations. All obligations to The W must be met regardless of withdrawal status. Refunds are made based on The W policy and are associated with date of withdrawal. Leaving The W without withdrawal notice will result in failing grades in all courses for which the student is registered.

**Application to Graduate Program:** Students will be granted their bachelor's degree when they complete all of the undergraduate requirements; they are undergraduate students until that point. Students must apply for admission into the SLP graduate program during their senior year by the prescribed deadline. Acceptance to the W's Automatic Admission Program does not guarantee admission to The W's Graduate School.

#### 1.0 Call to Order

Dr. Bob Fuller, Chair of the Department of Education, called the meeting to order.

#### 2.0 Approval of October 25, 2024 Minutes

Dr. Ballard made a motion to approve the minutes and Dr. Buehler seconded. The committee accepted the minutes.

#### 3.0 Scholarship Update

Dr. Adams reported that more information is needed to be given to CES before a flyer can be made.

#### 4.0 M.Ed. Admission Requirements (licensed/non-licensed)

Faculty discussed whether the Masters of Education program should be only for licensed educators. After reviewing other IHLs, it was decided that the verbiage regarding the license requirement will be removed from the website and requirements.

In the FAQ section, "licensed educators" will be removed and changed to P-12 educators and add "proof of eligibility" in area needed. Dr. Buehler volunteered to to private schools to recruit for the program. A flyer will be made to distribute. The most asked questions are how long the program takes, what is the cost, and what are the deadlines for applications. All three of these items need to be on the flyer.

It was asked if we can do a flat rate for the M.Ed program like what is done in the College of Business. Ms. Brittany Hunnicutt said that she would talk to Dr. Hatton about it and see if this was an option.

#### 5.0 M.Ed. Student Improvement Plan

Dr. Hodges presented the group the Disposition Infracton Form with an updated purpose statement and evaluation worksheet. Dr. Ballard mentioned that the words "Graduate Student", "Teacher Candidate", "Mentor Teacher", and "University Supervisor" all need to be capitalized to be consistent across all our documentation.

Dr. Ballard made a motion to approve, and Dr. Durst seconded. The form was unanimously approved. It will be piloted in the Spring, and then added to the Graduate Handbook for the 2025-2026 academic year.

#### 6.0 Key Assessments Rubrics

Dr. Hodges and Dr. Ballard are working on them. They will be presented for the January meeting.

#### 7.0 GPA Admittance Requirements for M.Ed.

Dr. Ballard researched program admission requirements and presented recommendations to the committee. Currently, The W requires candidates to have a 3.0 GPA for program admission. However, the Mississippi Department of Education (MDE) does not have a mandated GPA requirement for entry into educator preparation programs. Dr. Ballard suggested adjusting the GPA requirement to a minimum of 2.75, calculated based on the last 60 credit hours of coursework. Additionally, candidates would need to provide "proof of eligibility" as part of the admission process.

After presenting the recommendations, the committee reviewed and discussed them. A motion to approve the recommendations was made by Dr. Durst and seconded by Dr. Hodges. Following deliberation, the committee voted to approve the proposed changes.

#### 8.0 Elementary Education MAT

Dr. Ballard provided an update on the Mississippi Department of Education's (MDE) requirement for 33 credit hours in specific areas. She confirmed that all necessary information for meeting this requirement is available. The proposal includes 18 credit hours in any area currently offered within the MAT program.

The committee discussed the timing and structure of the courses. Questions were raised regarding when candidates would complete the required coursework and the plan for offering them. Currently, summer courses are available, but a course mapping process needs to be undertaken to ensure alignment.

Dr. Ballard indicated that the necessary forms for the proposal have already been completed. A motion to approve initiating this process and presenting it to Graduate Council in January so it can make it to MDE by February 15th was made by Dr. Buehler and seconded by Dr. Hodges. The committee voted to move forward with the proposal.

# 9.0 Program Review (MAT): Next Steps

Dr. Ballard will have ready before Christmas break.

The meeting adjourned at 2:21 P.M.
