Active Shooter Response

In the event of an active shooter, it's critical to act quickly and follow the Avoid, Deny, Defend strategy:

1. AVOID

• If you can safely escape the area, do so immediately.

Once you are in a safe location, call 911 and provide as much information as possible.

2. DENY

- If escape is not possible, take action to deny the shooter access to your location:
- o Lock and barricade doors using heavy furniture or other objects.
- o Turn off lights and silence your phone.
- o Hide behind solid objects and stay quiet.Do not open the door until law enforcement gives the all-clear.

3. DEFEND

- As a last resort, if your life is in immediate danger, be prepared to defend yourself:
- o Use improvised weapons (chairs, fire extinguishers, etc.). Act with commitment and aggression—do whatever is necessary to survive.

Campus Lockdown Procedures

During an active shooter event, a campus lockdown will be initiated to limit the movement of the threat.

When instructed to lockdown:

- 1. Quickly secure all exterior doors to your building.
- 2. Check commonly used doors to ensure they are closed, not propped open and functioning correctly.
- 3. Electronic access control doors will automatically lock, and card access will be disabled.
- 4. Do not allow anyone to enter the building once lockdown has started.
- 5. If you are locked out, do not try to re-enter. Instead, look for the safest route off campus and contact authorities when possible.

Remain in lockdown until an official notification is received declaring it is safe to exit.
